

Home Security Calling

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Here is another of my “Bright Ideas.” As with all the others, I freely place it here for any and all to develop. If a Patent or Copyright results from this, I would be honored to have my name included on that but I don’t hold anyone to my request because it is only a request. Either way, I hope someone puts this together and soon.

This is the situation you might someday find yourself in. You are away from your home. Perhaps you are a long ways away on vacation or just on a short trip to the store. Your cell phone rings. You answer it and see the interior of your house and someone taking your property out the front door. On the screen is the question, “Should 911 be dialed?” and you press the ‘yes’ button. You report the ongoing theft at your residence. The police arrive in time to apprehend the thief and save your possessions. This type of devise would also be great as a nighttime burglar alarm.



How is this possible? First, you need a cell phone that is more than a telephone as most are today. On your phone, you install an “App” (short for ‘application’) like you would any other. Let’s call the app “Home Security” for now.

At home, in as many places as you think you need, you put a video camera with a motion detector. Once this device is activated or turned on, it waits about ten or so seconds for you to leave. From then until you return and turn the device off, any motion will activate the camera, dial your cell phone and activate the “Home Security” app installed on your cell phone.

This app will ask the question about calling 911. The emergency 911 dialed would be from your home not your cell phone but the two would be connected. If you were in Connecticut and your home is in California, calling the 911 in Connecticut would only delay things. You would be able to speak to people nearest your home and describe in detail what is happening.



Some extras could be included for little additional effort and cost. A devise installed to record all the images from the camera. A connection made to your home smoke detector. Rechargeable batteries installed to run the whole thing in case the power goes off.

I leave the details up to you and good luck. Let me know if you are able to build and market the “Home Security” app and equipment.
